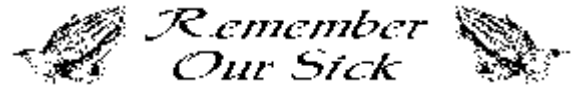

REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL

Hoy, con la fiesta de la Trinidad, iniciamos el tiempo litúrgico llamado "ordinario", llamado así porque no es un tiempo fuerte como lo es, por ejemplo, la Pascua. Sin embargo, no es menos importante que aquel; ya que se podría decir que la fiesta de la Trinidad proyecta toda su luz sobre la vida y enseñanza cotidiana de Jesús, de la cual trata el tiempo ordinario.

De hecho, la acción del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo, estuvo presente en el momento mismo de la creación. Esto nos lo constató el evangelista Juan diciéndonos: *"La Palabra estaba en el principio con Dios" y "todas las cosas fueron hechas por él, y sin él no fue hecho nada de todo lo que existe"*. Por lo tanto, desde su inicio la creación estuvo marcada radicalmente por la comunión entre el Padre y el Hijo. Lo cual significa que toda la realidad creada está hecha de comunión y para la comunión. Es por eso que Dios, después de crear al hombre dijo: *"No es bueno que el hombre esté solo"*. Exactamente, como Dios mismo no está solo.

El Dios de Jesús no es un dios solitario, sino una comunión de tres personas que se aman y se alegran tanto que llegan a ser una sola cosa. Pero, eso no significa que se quedan ensimismados dentro de su amor y su alegría, sino que lo derraman, a través del Espíritu Santo, sobre toda creatura. Por eso, Juan escribe diciendo: *"Tanto amó Dios al mundo que dio a su Hijo único, para que todo aquel que en él cree no se pierda, sino que tenga vida eterna"*. Eso significa que el envío del Hijo no nace de una obligación legal sino de una sobreabundancia de amor.

La Trinidad, por lo tanto, no es más que este misterio de amor sobreabundante que desde el cielo ha sido derramado sobre la tierra superando todas las fronteras, todos los límites, incluso toda fe. Ella ha querido entrar en la historia nuestra como una energía irrefrenable para quien lo acoge y como una fuerza que llama a todos a ser parte de ella. Este es el horizonte final que el misterio de la Trinidad revela a los hombres. Horizonte que es un reto para todos nosotros, indistintamente de nuestra cultura o religión. Es el desafío de vivir en el amor y en la comunión en un mundo que da mayor cabida al particularismo y al individualismo. Allí donde hay amor y comunión, allí está Dios.
