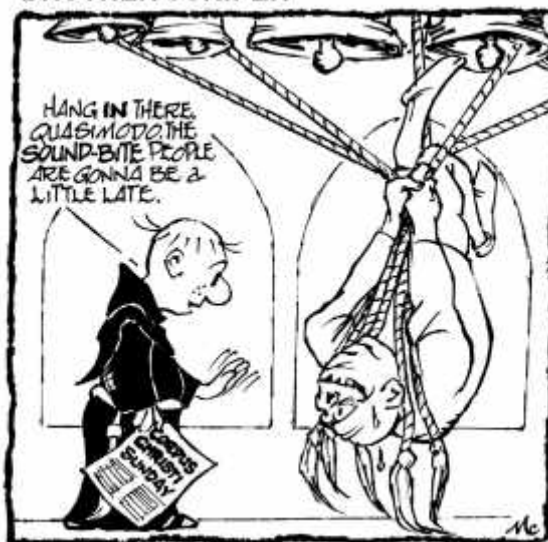

REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL

Hoy celebramos el sacramento de la Eucaristía que el Señor nos ha dejado como un signo de su presencia, de su realidad corporal, de su sacrificio en la cruz y de la vida eterna que nos ha hecho partícipes. Jesús nos habló de todo eso con los términos de cuerpo y alimento.

El don más preciado que nuestro Padre celestial ha querido concedernos se expresa, desde el principio hasta el fin, en la forma de cuerpo. Se trata, en primer lugar, de la realidad carnal del cuerpo hecho de carne y sangre, que sufre y muere sobre la cruz. Es este cuerpo herido y maltratado el que resucita y que Jesús permite ver y tocar a los apóstoles. Pero Jesús, en segundo lugar, no se detuvo aquí, sino que también ha querido permanecer con nosotros a través de la Iglesia, Cuerpo Místico de la cual Él es la cabeza; y, a través de su cuerpo sacramental que nutre a los que lo comen: "Yo soy el pan vivo que ha bajado del cielo; el que coma de este pan vivirá para siempre".

Ya los primeros cristianos compararon el cuerpo partido de Cristo al trigo, molido en forma de harina para llegar a ser pan, después de estar mezclado al agua de la vida y pasado en el fuego del Espíritu.

Este pan espiritual alimenta en nosotros la vida divina, que es la vida eterna. Jesús afirma: "Yo soy el pan"; es decir, Él es el único alimento que puede dar la vida divina. Quien no come de este pan no tendrá la vida en Él.

He aquí el por qué celebramos hoy la realidad humana y divina de la Palabra hecha carne, y también la del cuerpo resucitado. A través de él, entramos concretamente en comunión con nuestro Dios y hacemos realidad la necesidad que tenemos de estar presentes en su presencia real.
