REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL

Quando Jesus quería transmitir una verdad divina y eterna, atemporal, no hecha de conceptos abstractos, sino de imágenes concretas, usaba las parábolas. Estas parábolas permanecieron y perduraron en el tiempo. A lo largo de nuestra historia, hemos tenido diversos sistemas de pensamiento e ideologías, pero todos ellos pasaron, desaparecieron en el tiempo. Las parábolas de Jesús permanecieron y permanecerán en el tiempo, ya que su lenguaje es y será siempre actual. Es como si Jesús los dijera hoy, ahora mismo, en esta coyuntura histórica particular.

Es tarea del ser humano, dentro de su libertad, entrar en su misterio más profundo o permanecer en la superficie, fuera de ella. Sólo el que camina con humildad, dejándose guiar por el Espíritu de Dios entra en lo más profundo de su ser y persive dentro de él toda la belleza humana y divina del cual está constituido. En cambio, aquellos que están gobernados por el orgullo y la arrogancia espiritual, se mantienen a flote, ven algo, pero no logran acercarse a la verdad. Se quedan en el vacío, porque sus corazones están llenos de pensamientos de pecado y vicio. Para ellos se cierran las puertas del Reino. Permanecen en la mundanalidad, el paganismo, la idolatría y la impiedad. El orgullo es el verdadero obstáculo a la verdad de Dios.

El arrogante jamás podrá obstaculizar la verdad, la voluntad, el Reino de Dios en la historia. No podrá impedir que se cumpla. Esto, porque el Señor aleja todo obstáculo humanos del pecado con su sabiduría y comprensión divina, usando un lenguaje sencillo que es rechazado por los eruditos y sabios según la carne. A ellos no se les ha dado la gracia de conocer el reino de Dios. Y no se les ha dado porque ellos mismos han querido y quieren permanecer fuera a través de sus actitudes de cerrazón.

Dios nunca podrá hacer fructificar su palabra en un corazón que la rechaza, la pisotea o lo utiliza para hacer daño. Dios quiere la salvación de todos. Para todos ha enviado desde el cielo su Palabra. Para todos ha entregado a su Hijo único. Para todos hizo el regalo del Espíritu Santo. Pero, ¿quién realmente se beneficia de este don divino? Quién realmente lo valora? Sólo la buena tierra. Sólo el terreno bien labrado y preparado recibe la Palabra y lo lleva a la fructificación. En otras tierras, mal labradas y mal preparadas, la palabra nunca llegará a la madurez, porque no hay condiciones ideales para que dé frutos de vida eterna.

El Señor, por lo tanto, no es responsable por cuantos se pierden. Permita esta semana tener un tiempo para preparar nuestro corazón como un terreno bien labrado capaz de acoger la palabra de Dios y tener una vida bien lograda como si fuera un fruto agradable a Dios. Amén.
