### **REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL**

Al igual que el domingo pasado, también hoy, el Señor, continúa enseñando en parábolas "a la muchedumbre" y les expone tres importantes y decisivas para nuestro camino de fe.

La primera parábola trata del destino de la semilla, la palabra de Jesús, cuyo crecimiento está obstaculizado por la acción del enemigo que siembra en medio del trigo la cizaña, una maleza de raíces fuertes que se aferra a las del trigo. Para evitar dañar la buena semilla, ella no es erradicada antes de la cosecha. Sólo entonces es posible separar el grano de la cizaña. El punto central de la parábola se refiere a la coexistencia entre el trigo y la cizaña: a pesar de la presencia del mal en el mundo, Dios, en Jesús, lleva a cabo su plan de salvación. De hecho, Jesús se dirige a todos, buenos y pecadores, y a través de su acción, Dios siembra la buena semilla en los corazones de todos y hace que crezca; solo a Él le toca separar la cizaña al final de los tiempos. El tiempo que vivimos no es el tiempo aún de la cosecha, sino de la paciencia, de la tolerancia: cuándo llegue el juicio final tendrá lugar la separación de los justos y los malvados. Aplicado esto a nuestra Iglesia, se puede decir que ella no es una comunidad de purificados, sino una realidad mixta, en la cual conviven buenos y malos. De hecho, no se puede trazar una línea entre los dos grupos, ya que el bien y el mal coexisten en el creyente individual. El juicio pertenece a Dios y el creyente está obligado a imitar su bondad, esperando con paciencia, tolerancia, el momento en el cual el mal será separado definitivamente del bien. Así, a partir de la parábola se desprende una lección importante: se necesita alimentar la máxima confianza en la Palabra y en la acción de Dios, como en la eficacia del anuncio del Evangelio, a pesar de la presencia del mal en el mundo.

La segunda parábola está unida a aquella de la levadura. Tanto la semilla de la mostaza como la levadura se refieren al ministerio de Jesús, que al inicio parecía insignificante, pero que después la grandeza del arbusto y la enorme cantidad de masa fermentada, mostrarían el efecto que este ministerio tendría en el mundo. Los frutos del ministerio de Jesús hoy se pueden constatar no sólo en la expansión de la Iglesia sino también en la vitalidad del Evangelio y en el testimonio del reino de Dios anunciado por los misioneros de la Palabra.

En la segunda parte del discurso, Jesús se dirige solamente a los discípulos. A ellos les explica la parábola de la cizaña. Mientras que la parábola se centra en la separación de lo bueno y de lo malo en el día del juicio, la explicación se refiere al destino final de los seguidores de Jesús. Con la explicación, Él tiene como objetivo sacudirnos del letargo del pecado e indicarnos el destino que les espera a los pecadores. Por lo tanto, depende de nosotros los creyentes asumir el dinamismo del Evangelio. Amén.
