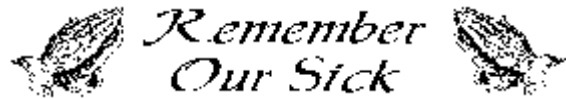

**REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL**

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús nos dice que el reino de los cielos es semejante a un tesoro escondido en un campo. El hombre que lo encuentra no se lo agarra ni se lo lleva. Considera más fructífero comprar aquel campo; señal de que el tesoro es el mismo campo. De hecho, el campo, la tierra, es el lugar donde podemos trabajar, construir, invitar a otros a trabajar a fin de que el campo pueda convertirse realmente en nuestro tesoro y en el tesoro de muchos. El campo es la propia vida; es cada lugar y cada realidad que nos permite orar y construir relaciones importantes. El campo es un tesoro, porque es la tierra prometida, el lugar donde se realiza el reino de Dios para nosotros.

Si descubrimos que es un tesoro y lo bendecimos, si nos damos cuenta que es aquella perla que puede dar sentido y alegría a nuestra vida, tenemos que hacer todo lo posible para cultivarlo y hacerlo fecundo.

Al final del Evangelio, Jesús nos plantea esta inquietante pregunta: “¿Han entendido todo esto?”. Lo cual significa que para Jesús la vida (como lugar donde se realiza el reino de Dios) y su realización no es algo superficial, sino algo fundamental y, que por tanto, nosotros tampoco podemos considerarla como algo sin importancia. La vida necesita ser contruida y necesita ser cuidada “como una perla muy valiosa”. Por eso, en nuestro diario vivir, es importante la reflexión y la oración. Son estos momentos los que permiten tener una vida bien lograda, y por ende, una vida realizada de acuerdo a la voluntad del Creador.

Hoy, Jesús nos llama a ser como un “negociante” y un “escriba”, como uno que no sólo vende y compra, sino también como uno que ora, estudia y reflexiona lo que es conveniente. Y así, llegar a ser “semejante al padre de familia, que va sacando de su tesoro cosas nuevas y cosas antiguas”; es decir, que tiene en sí valores y tradiciones, pero que también está abierto a la novedad de Jesús y de un Dios que cada día es capaz de inventar proyectos, vocaciones y nuevas ideas.

Ojalá hoy el Señor nos dé también la sabiduría que Salomón pidió para poder discernir qué cosa es bueno y qué cosa es malo, útil e inútil, fuente de alegría, “para que todo contribuya para el bien de los que aman a Dios”, como nos dijo hoy san Pablo, en la primera lectura. Amén.
