**REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL**

La liturgia de la Iglesia, en este día, nos invita a contemplar la Transfiguración de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Salvador nuestro.

Antes de este evento, Jesús había anunciado a sus discípulos acerca de su pasión y muerte. Lo cual produjo en ellos tristeza y vacilación. Por lo tanto, la intención de Jesús, con su transfiguración, fue fortalecer la fe vacilante de ellos, ya que había sido puesta en crisis por la predicación de su crucifixión.

San Mateo nos dice que Jesús *"tomó consigo a Pedro, a Santiago y a Juan, y los hizo subir a solas con él a un monte elevado"*. Muchos estudiosos de la Biblia identifican este monte con el Tabor; otros proponen el monte Hermón. El evangelista habla a menudo de "monte"; al cual le atribuye un valor simbólico: un lugar privilegiado para la oración, un lugar para estar más cerca de Dios. Es bueno que nosotros, también en este tiempo, encontremos un lugar donde podamos estar mucho más cerca de Dios y poder hablar a solas con él.

La transfiguración de Jesús indica una transformación momentánea de su cuerpo, prefiguración de la gloria pascual. Aquí es Dios quien revela a los discípulos la verdadera identidad de Jesús: *"Este es mi Hijo muy amado"*. En Jesús, el Padre se complace porque a través de él lleva a cabo su plan de salvación; por este motivo, todos nosotros debemos escuchar a ese Jesús que revela el infinito amor del Padre.

La presencia de Moisés y Elías designa la plenitud de la revelación divina del Antiguo Testamento, Ley y Profetas. Esta plenitud se concretizó en la encarnación de la Palabra y en su misión en medio de los hombres. Siendo así, misión nuestra es concretizar esa Palabra en nuestras vidas y darlas a conocer especialmente a aquellos que se han olvidado de ella.

Cuando Jesús regresó a su estado normal tocó a sus discípulos quienes, por su parte, se habían quedado como muertos: *"levántense"* significa "resuciten". Es tiempo de que Jesús toque nuestras vidas y acabe con todo aquello que nos mantiene como muertos y nos devuelva la vida divina que recibimos el día de nuestro bautismo.

Por eso, es bueno recordar que Jesús transfigurado es la salvación del ser humano: Él tiene la intención de conducirnos a todos a la verdadera vida, a la Gloria divina; él es el profeta del cumplimiento final de todas las cosas que debemos escuchar para poder conseguir los bienes futuros del Reino. Amén.
