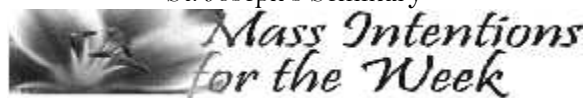

REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL

La parábola que este domingo nos cuenta el evangelista Mateo hace referencia al mensaje central de Jesús: el amor libre y gratuito del Padre. El salario que el propietario decide dar a aquel que vino a trabajar "al caer la tarde", provocó la reacción de los que estaban allí desde temprano. La igualdad en el tratamiento les supo a injusticia. El propietario rechazó la acusación: "¿Acaso no quedamos en que te pagaría un denario? Toma, pues, lo tuyo y vete".

La justicia de Dios está por encima de la justicia humana. Ella tiene en cuenta las necesidades más profundas de las personas, de aquellos que contra su voluntad "estaban en la plaza" porque nadie los había contratado. Los obreros de la tarde tienen el mismo derecho a trabajar que los primeros, y a vivir ellos y sus familias de ese trabajo. Con ello, el Señor nos enseña que el derecho al trabajo es una manifestación del derecho a la vida y que toda sociedad está llamada a buscar el pleno empleo de todos sus miembros.

Pero hay algo más en esta parábola. "Yo quiero darle al que llegó al último lo mismo que a ti", dice el Señor. Y luego pregunta en forma incisiva: "¿O vas a tenerme rencor porque soy bueno?". El texto original en griego dice: "¿o va a ser tu ojo malo porque yo soy bueno?". Este es el fondo del asunto. La expresión literal "ojo malo" es reveladora. Se trata de una mirada que petrifica la realidad, que no deja lugar a lo nuevo ni espacio a la generosidad, y, sobre todo, que pretende poner barreras a la bondad divina. Es la mirada que hechamos alrededor nuestro para defender nuestros intereses, es la que nos lleva a levantar muros para proteger nuestras propiedades aunque ello signifique la pobreza de los otros. Esa mirada nos hace pensar que aquello que es justo para los demás es injusto para nosotros si afecta nuestros privilegios.

Permita este domingo evitar "el ojo malo" y tener una mirada amplia que nos muestre no sólo las necesidades de los demás sino también nos ayude a descubrir la gratitud del amor que se encuentra en nuestros corazones para realizar en todo momento el bien debido. Si nuestro Dios es bueno

concediendo todo gratuitamente, ¿por qué no, también nosotros? Amén.
