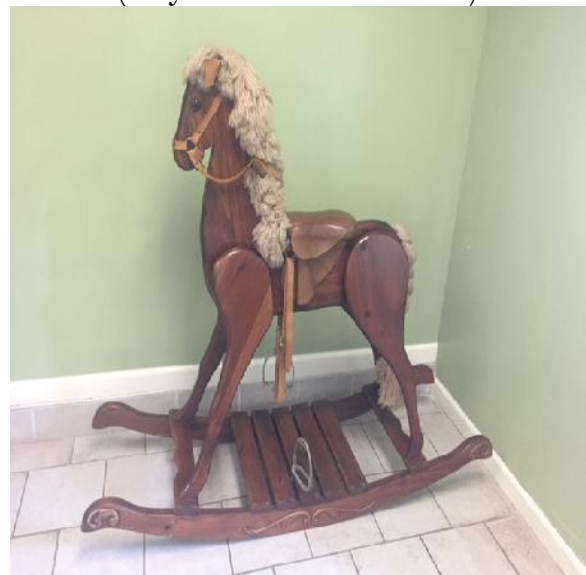

**REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL**

La parábola de hoy es simple y cuestionante. Su  
mensaje tiene que ver con el hacer la voluntad de Dios. El relato  
de la parábola es sobrio, no se dan las razones del comportamiento  
de los dos hijos, simplemente se describen. Pese a su reserva  
inicial, el segundo hijo cumple con la voluntad del Padre. Sus  
palabras dijeron no, pero su gesto terminó diciendo sí. El primero,  
en cambio, es un mentiroso: acepta en teoría lo que niega en la  
práctica. Es un incoherente.

El seguimiento de Jesús se juega en nuestra práctica,  
ella decide el destino ante Dios. El hacer está por encima del decir.  
La pregunta de Jesús no deja lugar a escapatoria y exige  
discernimiento: "¿Cuál de los dos hizo la voluntad del Padre?". No  
basta responder: "el segundo"; sino también es necesario  
interpelarse aún más: ¿con cuál de los dos me identifico? ¿Cuál  
creo que es el camino de justicia? ¿Somos de aquellos que piensan  
que basta con decir sí, sí, Señor para entrar en el Reino?  
Acomodarse a formalidades – incluso religiosas – rinde  
dividendos. Siguiendo las pautas dominantes en la sociedad nos  
evitamos problemas, y somos bien considerados. Esa no es la  
justicia de que nos habla Jesús, aquellos que pretenden ser buenos  
observantes de la ley serán precedidos en el Reino – nos dice con  
audacia – por quienes ellos estiman que son sus mayores  
violadores: publicanos y prostitutas, pecadores públicos. Es una de  
las frases más duras del Señor. Ella nos sitúa en el terreno de la  
justicia que exige el Reino: poner en práctica la voluntad del  
Padre que ama a toda persona y en especial a los más necesitados  
y despreciados. Practicar el derecho y la justicia, dice Ezequiel.  
Justicia que es vida y a la que debemos, todos sin excepción,  
convertirnos permanentemente. Esa demanda juzga nuestra  
existencia. Ante ella aparece claro que sólo la soberbia puede  
hacer creer que somos "justos" y sembrar dudas sobre la conducta  
y las creencias de quienes no coinciden con nosotros.

Para hacer la voluntad del Padre el Señor nos señala el  
camino de la humildad: "se anonadó a sí mismo, tomando la condición  
de siervo". Dejó de lado todo privilegio. Nuestra condición de  
cristianos, nuestra responsabilidad en la Iglesia, no deben ser  
motivo de "vanagloria" y prepotencia, sino de solidaridad. Sólo así  
hay una auténtica "comunidad en el Espíritu". El hermoso himno  
de Filipenses, en la segunda lectura, nos recuerda que la  
inmersión en la historia es el camino que toma el Hijo de Dios  
para hacernos sus amigos. Amén.
