### **REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL**

El evangelio de hoy nos trae la parábola conocida como la de los viñadores homicidas. La designación es exacta, y no sólo porque en ella se menciona el asesinato del hijo del propietario de la viña. Se trata de una viña que no ha dado frutos. Los responsables de ello, los labradores, reaccionan además violentamente ante los enviados del dueño que fueron a recoger el resultado de su trabajo.

¿De qué fruto se trata? La pregunta es clave para el significado del texto. La referencia que se hace del pasaje de Isaías, que nos es presentado en la primera lectura del día, nos ayuda a dar una respuesta apropiada. En ese canto, Isaías nos dice que de aquella viña que había plantado, el Señor *“esperaba de ellos que obraran rectamente y ellos, en cambio, cometieron iniquidades; él esperaba justicia y sólo se oyen reclamaciones”*. Establecer la justicia y el derecho es una de las grandes exigencias de Dios en el Antiguo Testamento. Es más, en esa tarea se expresa la fidelidad a la Alianza entre Dios y su pueblo. El Dios de la vida y del amor quiere que en medio de su pueblo reine la justicia y se respete el derecho de todos, en particular el de los más pobres. Esos son los frutos que debió dar la viña que el Señor plantó y cuidó.

Pero, como se ve, los arrendatarios no han practicado la justicia, no han establecido el derecho. Peor aún; entre ellos hay asesinatos y quejas por los maltratos que se cometen. En la Biblia la opresión de los pobres es presentada frecuentemente como un homicidio. No es pues extraño que reaccionen frente a los enviados del Señor con el mismo desprecio a la vida del otro que manifiestan en su conducta cotidiana. Los viñadores son, en consecuencia, homicidas no sólo porque matan a esos mensajeros, o incluso al hijo, sino porque despojan al pobre y violan el derecho. Son homicidas desde el momento en que no dan los frutos de justicia que pide el Señor, por ello el Reino de Dios irá a dar a otras manos. Las expresiones son fuertes, pero lo estamos viendo en estos días ante la situación de gente que reclama un derecho elemental: el derecho a comer.

Por tanto, hoy el evangelio nos lleva a preguntarnos también si en nuestra vida de todos los días no hay algún tipo de complicidad con los viñadores homicidas. Podemos preguntarnos, por ejemplo, ¿qué papel juega en nosotros el establecimiento de la justicia y el derecho? ¿cuáles son nuestros frutos? El propio evangelio de Mateo nos dirá unos capítulos más adelante que no dar de comer al pobre es negarlo a Cristo mismo, lo que significa condenar al pobre, y a Cristo, a la muerte. Ser cristiano es precisamente lo contrario, es dar vida. Eso es lo que pide el evangelio, si lo ponemos por obra, el Dios de la paz estará con nosotros. Amén.
