The service project will be to clean-up Christmas decorations from the St. Anastasia Cemetery.

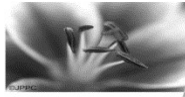

### REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL

El Evangelio de este domingo nos presenta un resumen de la predicación de Jesús y el llamado a sus primeros discípulos. Galilea es una región despreciada y sospechosa para las personas de la otra provincia judía, Judea. Se trata de una zona vecina a poblaciones paganas e influida por ellas en sus costumbres, en su religiosidad, en su hablar. Nada bueno puede salir de Galilea, piensan los buenos judíos. En consecuencia, Jesús, el galileo (Nazareth está en Galilea), anuncia su mensaje desde la insignificancia y la marginalidad. Desde los pobres y despreciados llega la palabra de amor universal del Dios de Jesucristo. Los poderosos y privilegiados se resisten a entender el llamado, el evangelista lo hace notar refiriendo que Juan fue hecho preso. Aviso premonitorio de lo que le ocurrirá a Jesús.

Con el testimonio de Jesús, afirmando que "se ha cumplido el tiempo", ha llegado el día del Señor. En él se revela la voluntad de Dios sobre la historia. Eso es el Reino. No se trata de una realidad puramente interior que acontece en el fondo de nuestras almas. Es un proyecto de Dios que ocurre en el corazón de una historia en la que los seres humanos viven y mueren. El Reino de amor y justicia es el proyecto de Dios para la historia humana, interpela por eso a toda persona.

Ser cristiano es estar atento a ese momento especial de manifestación de Dios en nuestro aquí y ahora. Allí se juega la dimensión auténticamente profética de toda vida cristiana. Atención al juicio de Dios acerca de la situación que viven las grandes mayorías de hispanos en este país. Atención también a lo que señala una reacción contra un estado de cosas contrario al Reino de vida, a los gestos de solidaridad entre los pobres, al testimonio de comunidades cristianas que surgen entre los pobres y marginados de este mundo, a las expresiones de respeto por todas las dimensiones de la persona humana, a la alegría y la esperanza del pueblo pobre en medio del sufrimiento, al aprendizaje de una oración profunda en el seno de una lucha por la liberación. Todo eso son signos de la presencia del Reino en nuestra propia historia.

Acoger el reinado de Dios reclama un comportamiento: "arrepentase", requerimiento urgente, "la vida es corta", que acompaña el don del Reino y genera una nueva actitud ante Dios y ante el hermano. A Jonás se le encarga la tarea de llamar a la conversión de Nínive, capital del imperio enemigo de Israel. El profeta, judío amante de su patria, se resiste a cumplir esa tarea, pero finalmente acepta la voluntad de perdón del Señor que no tiene límites raciales ni religiosos. El Reino es gracia, pero es también exigencia para nosotros. Los primeros discípulos escucharon "la Buena Nueva" y fueron llamados a asociarse a la tarea de Jesús. El Evangelio marcó sus vidas. Debe también marcar las nuestras. Amén.
