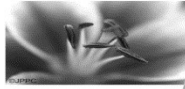

**REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL**

El evangelio de hoy nos presenta cómo los fariseos, judíos nacionalistas, se alían a sus enemigos tradicionales, los seguidores de Herodes, colaborador de los romanos y por consiguiente traidor a su pueblo. Ocurre ahora que tienen que enfrentar a su adversario mayor: Jesús que ha venido a anunciar el Reino de Dios y el papel que los pobres – despreciados por los fariseos– ocupan en él. Por eso se unen; juntos van a verlo para, con palabras remilgadas, hacerlo caer en falta ante la autoridad política que ejercen quienes tienen sometido a su pueblo.

“¿Es lícito o no pagar el tributo al César?” le preguntan. La respuesta de Jesús se inicia con un desenmascaramiento: “Hipócritas, ¿por qué tratan de sorprenderme?”. Las cosas deben ser claras. Jesús no se engaña ante los fingidos elogios que le acaban de dirigir. Luego les pide que le muestren una moneda, un denario; ante la inscripción que se halla en él, les dice: “al César lo que es del César, y a Dios lo que es de Dios”. Se entiende a veces esta afirmación como una enseñanza sobre la distinción entre dos dominios, el político y el religioso. Pero el texto que comentamos apunta a algo más profundo.

Los fariseos hablaban de “pagar” al César. Jesús habla de “devolver” la moneda al César. Son cosas distintas. En el denario está inscrita la efigie de su propietario. El dinero pertenece al opresor romano. En la pregunta de los fariseos está insinuada la posibilidad de no pagar el tributo, pero también de quedarse entonces con el dinero. Su pretendido nacionalismo no llegaba sino hasta allí. Jesús va a la raíz: es necesario erradicar toda dependencia frente al dinero. No se trata sólo de romper con el dominio político del emperador, es necesario romper con la opresión que viene del apego al dinero y sus posibilidades de explotación de los demás. Devuélvanselo al César, les dice, y queden libres del dinero, así podrán adorar al Dios verdadero y darle lo que corresponde.

Si no nos libramos del imperio del dinero no podremos comprender lo que nos dice hoy Isaías en la primera lectura: “Yo soy el Señor y no hay otro; fuera de mí no hay Dios”. En este tiempo muchos hechos nos han hecho palpar el poder del dinero. Jesús nos invita a devolverle al César sus medios de explotación y olvido de los demás, a liberarnos del poder opresor del dinero y a reconocer la presencia persuasiva del Espíritu Santo en nosotros. Amén.
